

## Busan Metropolitan City Ordinance for Management of Public Bicycles

### Article 1 (Purpose)

The purpose of this Ordinance is to prescribe necessary matters for management of public bicycles to help citizens use public bicycles safely and conveniently.

### Article 2 (Definitions)

The terms used in this Ordinance shall be as follows:

1. The term "public bicycle" (hereinafter referred to as "bicycle") means a bicycle that Busan Metropolitan City (hereinafter referred to as "S") manages through the self-service rental system;
2. The term "member" means a person who pays the membership fee to use a bicycle and secures the right to use the bicycle for a certain period.
3. The term "facilities of bicycles" means a bicycle stand, bicycle location-tracking system, etc.;
4. The term "bicycle management center" means a facility built to efficiently manage and operate the bicycle equipment on the street of the city;

### Article 3 (Members)

(1) Members shall be categorized as yearly members, monthly members, and daily members, and the membership fee shall be as follows:

1. Yearly member: 20,000 won
2. Monthly member: 3,000 won
3. Daily member: 1,000 won

(2) The procedure of registration and the method of collecting and calculating the

membership fees shall be determined separately by the Busan Metropolitan City Mayor (hereinafter referred to as the "Mayor").

#### **Article 4 (Bicycle Rental Fees)**

(1) The bicycle rental fees shall be as follows:

1. Not longer than one hour: free of charge;
2. Longer than one hour: 500 won per 30 minutes;

(2) Detailed matters for methods of collecting and calculating bicycle rental fees shall be determined separately by the Mayor.

#### **Article 5 (Bicycle Rental Hours)**

(1) The rental hours for renting a bicycle shall be from 5 a.m. to 12 p.m. everyday:

*Provided*, That this shall not apply to any of the following cases:

1. Cases of repairing and mending bicycle equipment;
2. Cases necessary for the smooth opening of events held by the State or a *Si*;
3. Other cases expected to pose danger to safety of bicycle users.

(2) If a case falling under any subparagraph of paragraph (1) occurs, the Mayor shall post a notice stating the case and its period on the Internet web site in advance.

#### **Article 6 (Entrusted Management)**

(1) In order to efficiently manage and operate the facilities of bicycles and the bicycle management center, the Mayor may entrust the facilities of bicycles and the bicycle management center to a public company and a public corporation established by a *Si* pursuant to the Local Public Enterprises Act or a corporation and a group which have experience in managing public facilities.

(2) The Mayor shall, if he/she intends to entrust the management and operation of the facilities of bicycles and the bicycle management center pursuant to paragraph (1), conclude a contract of entrustment with an entrusted person (hereinafter referred to as "trustee"), and the term of the contract shall be up to five years.

#### **Article 7 (Expenses for Management)**

If the Mayor entrusts the management and operation of the facilities of bicycles and the bicycle management center pursuant to Article 6 (1), he/she shall pay the expenses for management from the membership fees referred to in Article 3 and from the rental fees referred to in Article 4. In such cases, the Mayor may financially support the insufficient expenses within budgetary limits.

#### **Article 8 (Duties of Trustee)**

(1) A trustee shall, with the care of a good manager, manage and operate the facilities of bicycles and the bicycle management center.

(2) A trustee may not transfer or sublease the right to manage and operate the facilities of bicycles and the bicycle management center to a third person without the Mayor's approval.

#### **Article 9 (Guidance and Supervision)**

(1) The Mayor may have a trustee report on the entrusted duties or have the related public officials inspect and examine the current status of and documents on management and operation of the facilities of bicycles and the bicycle management center.

(2) When the Mayor receives the report pursuant to paragraph (1) or when a violation

of the Acts and subordinate statues or this Ordinance, or unjustifiable matters are discovered, the Mayor shall order the trustee to correct them, or take other necessary measures.

#### **Article 10 (Termination of Contract of Entrustment)**

(1) The Mayor may terminate a contract of entrustment if a case falls any of the following subparagraphs:

1. Where a trustee violates the related acts and subordinate statues or this Ordinance;
2. Where a trustee violates the terms of the entrustment;
3. Where the facilities of bicycles and the bicycle management center cannot be managed and operated properly due to any case for which a trustee shall take responsibility.

(2) The Mayor shall hold a hearing if he/she intends to terminate a contract of entrustment referred to in paragraph (1).
